PSE Foundation's Community HEALing grants open now

The PSE Foundation has announced a Community HEALing focus for its competitive grant cycle. Grant applications of up to \$25,000 will be considered through August 31 for local community nonprofits and tribal governments serving the public within PSE's 10-county service area. The grant's purpose is to support immediate needs such as housing, food, childcare or other essential services and will intentionally allocate a portion of funding to organizations that focus on and support the communities of Black, Indigenous, and People of Color.

PSE seeks bid for new energy resources

PSE has issued a request for proposals (RFP) for new energy and capacity to meet customers' long-range electricity needs. This is PSE's first All-Source RFP issued since the passage of Clean Energy Transformation Act (CETA), which sets statewide policy goals for the elimination of coal-fired resources by December 31, 2025, 80 percent carbon free generation and overall carbon neutral electricity by 2030, and 100 percent carbon free electricity by 2045.

In January 2021, PSE set its aspirational "Beyond Net Zero Carbon" energy company goal. Through this initiative, PSE targets reduction of its own carbon emissions to net zero

"The new resources and technologies we could see from this process are exciting, because they would provide both environmental and reliability benefits," said Ron Roberts, PSE's senior vice president of energy supply. "PSE has a strong preference for renewable resources, and we are hoping to find that combination of renewable resources that will prove to be a sustainable, reliable and low-cost way to meet the needs of our customers identified in the RFP."

PSE filed its All-Source RFP with the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission in April and after a public comment period and open meeting the commission approved the RFP on June 14. Proposals are due to PSE by Sept. 1, 2021.

THE UNTOLD STORY OF ABORIGINAL WOMEN AND THEIR INDIPINO CHILDREN



PSE sponsors film "Honor Thy Mother"

PSE is sponsoring the film "Honor Thy Mother". The film was commissioned by the Indipino Community of Bainbridge Island & Vicinity and produced by the award-winning Stourwater Pictures. The West Sound Film Festival in Bremerton will screen the acclaimed "Honor Thy Mother" is the untold story of 36 Aboriginal women from Canada and Native women from tribes in Washington and Alaska who migrated in the 1940s to Bainbridge Island, the traditional territory of the Suquamish people. As survivors of Indian Residential Schools, they came, some still in their teens, to pick berries for Japanese American farmers, fell in love and married Filipino immigrants. They settled on the Island to raise their mixed-heritage, (Indigenous mother and Filipino father) Indipino children. The voices of the Indipino children, now elders, are integral in the storytelling of their mother's courage and resilience marrying Asian men and risking disenfranchisement from their 19 different tribes. Many Indipino children grew up in homes burdened with their father and mother's traumatic, collective memory of the Island's Japanese Americans forced removal after President Roosevelt signed Executive Order 9066 in 1942.

When HRB is not developing new homes or repairing older ones, it can be hard for someone who is not a resident in the HRB community to see the work that happens day in day out. This quarterly newsletter allows them to highlight the stories of impact and efforts underway. In an interview with Rental

association at Ferncliff Village, providing low interest loans and help with refinancing during times of financial stress, providing rental assistance and social services to qualified households, and more. As Holt says, "We see our tenants as clients to be supported and advocated for, not as assets or liabilities on the bottom line of the books."
