Investing in electric reliability and grid

Past Issues

Electric reliability on the island needs to be improved. In finding solutions, PSE committed to exploring new technologies. Our proposed plan is a unique solution designed for Bainbridge Island – combining new technologies and grid infrastructure to ensure safe, dependable power for families and businesses for years to come. We will partner with the community to implement these solutions.



Community Sounding Board meetings resume online

As part of our solution to improve reliability on Bainbridge Island, we're planning to build the "missing link" transmission line between the Murden Cove and Winslow substations. There are many ways the community can be involved, including a Community Sounding Board (CSB), community workshops, a comment form where community members can provide input and feedback 24/7, as well as by email and phone.

In light of the COVID-19 pandemic, we've adjusted our approach to hold the CSB meetings virtually while social distancing recommendations are still in place. The first CSB meeting is now planned for **Thursday, May 14 from 5 – 6:30 p.m.**, and will be held online via Webex. CSB meetings are open to the public to observe, and there will be a brief opportunity for public comment at each meeting.



Supporting communities dealing with the impacts of COVID-19

In order to help our community partners, the <u>PSE Foundation and PSE</u> teamed up to donate more than a million dollars to support COVID-19 relief efforts across our community. The PSE Foundation donated \$130,000 to regional food banks throughout our service area to support their operational costs.

All nine food banks in Kitsap County received assistance, including Bainbridge Island's own <u>Helpline House</u>. Andy Wappler, Vice President of Customer Operations and Communications shared a heartfelt thank you to Helpline House. "The work you do every day makes a difference for countless families. In addition to addressing hunger, your food bank provides a social touch point for some of our most vulnerable neighbors."
