WUTC approves PSE's new and expanded EV charging programs

PSE reached a milestone in realizing our vision for clean mobility when the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission (WUTC) approved our new and expanded electric vehicle charging programs at the end of May. The programs include Fleet & Commercial, Multi-Family, managed charging and expanded education and outreach for customers and communities.

The Fleet & Commercial program will benefit small businesses, school districts, municipalities, community-based organizations and other entities that are seeking to transition their fleets to electric vehicles, while the Multi-Family program will bring EV charging within reach for residents outside of single-family homes. The managed charging program will provide incentive credits based on the percentage of dedicated EV charging sessions occurring outside of morning and evening peak times to help mitigate load impacts to PSE's distribution system.

Our education and outreach efforts will build on existing information about vehicle

higher barriers to electrified transportation with cocreated, culturally relevant education and marketing materials, opportunities for hands-on experience with EVs, information through trusted messengers, and application and enrollment assistance.

The Fleet & Commercial, Multi-Family, managed charging and education and outreach programs will begin customer enrollment and engagement in January 2023. Additional EV products and services, including single-family residential, public, and workplace charging, will be proposed to the UTC by the Spring of 2023 to complete the full suite of PSE Transportation Electrification portfolio. PSE's Clean Building Accelerator Helps Commercial Building Owners

In response to the State of Washington's landmark Clean Building Performance Standard (HB1257), enacted into law in 2021, PSE is helping customers navigate their pathway to compliance through our no-cost Clean Buildings Accelerator program. Owners of commercial buildings greater than 50,000 square feet are subject to the law. The program coaches facility teams to understand the law and its components, assists in measuring energy consumption and target attainment, provides tools and templates for required submissions, and completes virtual energy scans of buildings to identify energy-saving

PSE customers are encouraged to sign up for a virtual program overview at <u>www.pse.com/cleanbuildings</u> and enroll in one of our upcoming group trainings. During the overview, we cover the basics of the law, explain the Clean Building Accelerator program, and help you decide if joining the next cohort of participants is right for you. Our experts will also be available to answer your questions and will follow up with you as needed. We have learned that each building's path to reach compliance looks a little different. No matter where your facility teams and buildings are at, the time to act is now since compliance often takes a year or more to accomplish. Nonprofit organizations and tribal governments located and providing services within Island, King, Kitsap, Kittitas, Lewis, Pierce, Snohomish, Skagit, Thurston, and Whatcom counties in Washington State can apply for a grant award ranging between \$5,000 - \$15,000 which will be selected through a competitive process. Local PSE employee volunteers, who are professionally trained in grant reviewing, will assess applications received from organizations within the community where they choose to work, live, and raise their families.
