Puget Sound Energy is committed to engaging with the Bainbridge Island community on route siting for the "missing link" transmission line project. Since the project was announced in October 2019 – as part of a package of five projects to meet the island's energy needs – PSE has encouraged the community to participate in the conversation through a variety of engagement opportunities.

Two thirds of the island is currently at risk of prolonged power outages due to the lack of transmission redundancy and reliable power, which impacts dozens of local businesses, schools, and families on the island. Given the broad impact, it's important to give all island residents and businesses the opportunity to share their feedback on the reliability challenges and provide input on the projects PSE is proposing to improve the electric system on the island.
